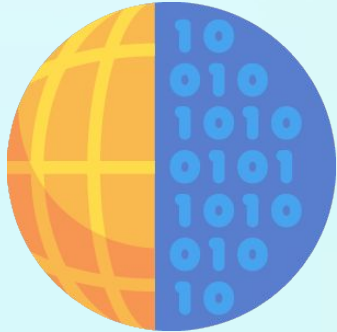

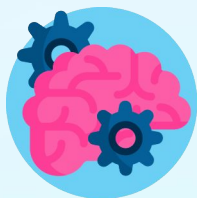

APPLICATION TIP: TIME ZONES



You can attend SIP virtual classrooms in Eastern, Central, or Pacific time zones.



You will select your preferred time zone on the application.



IMPORTANT: You must be available during the time zone you select. You cannot change your time zone later.
